ARTICULATION AGREEMENT For Police Science/Criminal Justice

Between
John Tyler Community College (JTCC)
And
Virginia State University (VSU)

For students planning to pursue Criminal Justice (CJUS) in the College of Humanities and Social Sciences at Virginia State University.

<u>Purpose</u>: This memorandum of understanding has been developed within the framework of the Virginia State Policy on Transfer (http://www.schev.edu/students/StatePolicyOnTransfer.pdf) to facilitate the transfer of credits earned by students with Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degrees in Police Science or Criminal Justice at John Tyler Community College into Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree programs in Criminal Justice at Virginia State University. It is intended to provide students enrolled in the Police Science or Criminal Justice A.A.S. program at John Tyler Community College admission into the baccalaureate criminal justice program in the College of Humanities and Social Sciences at Virginia State University. This agreement establishes a partnership between JTCC and VSU for the benefit of students.

JTCC will advertise this program to the general public on its web site. Representatives of JTCC and VSU will call attention to this articulation agreement when advising students. Students who intend to transfer to VSU under the terms of this agreement should complete the Letter of Interest after completing 15 credits at JTCC and send it to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, 1 Hayden Drive, P.O. Box 9018, Virginia State University, VA, 23806 (http://www.ysu.edu/). Students who complete the Letter of Interest will be contacted periodically by the College of Humanities and Social Sciences and/or VSU representatives with important information to ensure a successful transfer to the College of Humanities and Social Sciences.

Courses listed in this program will be reviewed, as needed, by the faculty of both institutions to ensure continuity of instruction, curriculum, and evaluation. The attached "Police Science/Criminal Justice Transfer Program Table" lists the respective transfer credits that will be awarded by VSU for courses offered by JTCC students for transfer under the terms of the Agreement. This table will be updated as curricula evolve. VSU will work with students who have a *Letter of Interest* on file to ensure that curriculum changes made after the *Letter* is received but prior to matriculation to VSU will not negatively impact the admissions decision. There is a limit of 81 credits that may be transferred to VSU from JTCC and course equivalency and transfer credits should be limited to those courses required for the student's selected major.

The College of Humanities and Social Sciences at Virginia State University guarantees admission into its B.S. program (Criminal Justice) with junior standing to those students in the JTCC Associate Degree in Police Science or Criminal Justice and who have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale and no individual grade lower than "C."

The College of Humanities and Social Sciences will consider JTCC students who have not completed the A.A.S. program for admission into its B.S. programs. However, the course equivalencies as stated in the Police Science/Criminal Justice Transfer Program Table are based on the completion of the Associate degree program prior to transfer. Course credit cannot be given for transfer courses in which the student earned below a "C" grade. Students who transfer prior to the completion of the associate degree program will have their courses evaluated individually per the VSU/ College of Humanities and Social Sciences Transfer Guide. Therefore, students are encouraged to complete the Associate degree prior to matriculating to VSU. Students can transfer credits back to JTCC from VSU.
